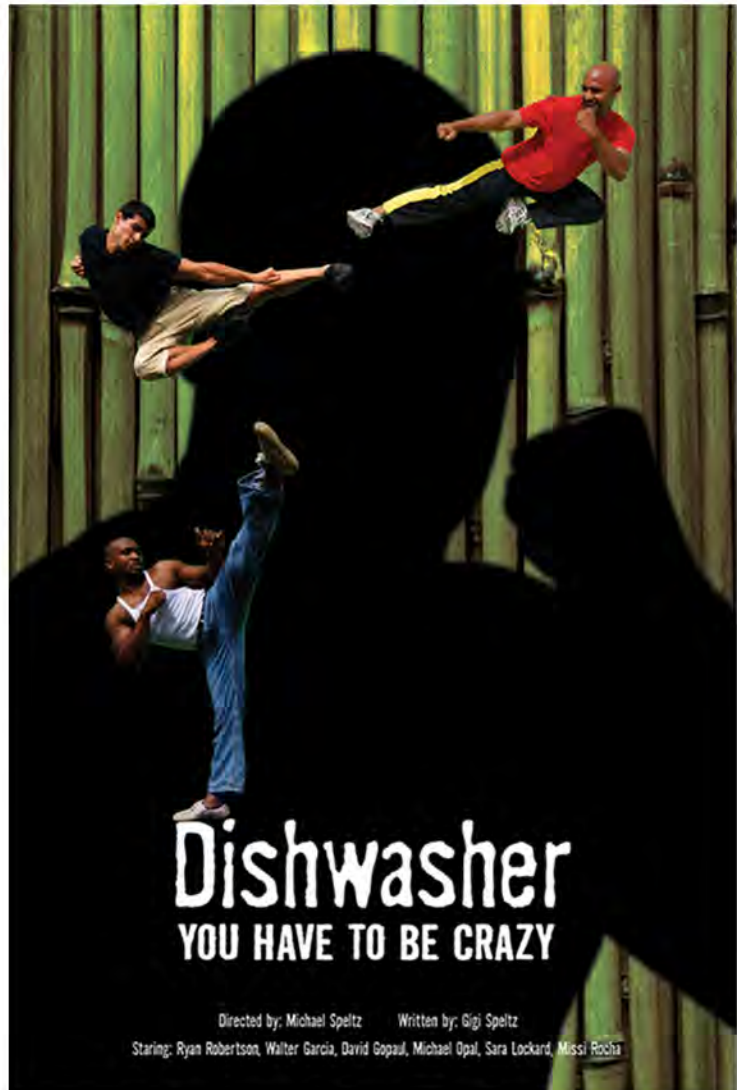

Ray’s platoon was assigned to root out a terrorist cell on a particular island, but Ray didn’t believe he’d ever really see any action. Ray failed to follow orders and was seriously injured and dishonorably discharged from the Marines as a result.

Our story begins ten years later, at an Irish Pub called “Fiddler’s Green”. Physically and mentally scarred, Ray washes dishes at the Pub, trying to keep a positive attitude. Ray soon meets the owner of the pub, wealthy entrepreneur John Devlin. Devlin is a multi-millionaire with a reputation as a ladies’ man. Devlin’s wife, Maureen, has a reputation as a straight-up bitch. Devlin’s got a girl on the side at each of his many businesses, and the girl at Fiddler’s Green is a server named Rebecca.

Ray finds himself floundering in a dirty sink full of deceit, lies and murder. Unable to hide from conflict, Ray must fight to discover the truth.
